annual Budget Town Meeting on June 5. The unanimity of approval was indeed gratifying, particularly in light of the vagaries and volatility of the State Budget process this year. Notification System [CTAlert ENS]. For more details on Town Meeting approved a Town Government budget of \$1,574,075 for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 and a Board of Education budget of \$3,818,151. It also appropriated \$499,460 from the Unassigned Fund Balance to finance a portion of the General Fund Operating Budget for the coming fiscal year and approved the FY 2017-2018 Municipal Reserve Budget of \$468,462 and accepted the Town's Ten-Year Capital Improvement Plan which includes the Town's capital spending plan for the 2017-2018 Fiscal Year. Also Town Meeting authorized the expenditure of \$145,000 from the Municipal Reserve Fund for the Eastford Elementary School Energy Project, specifically replacement of the gymnasium roof, and it authorized the Board of Selectmen to proceed on purchasing a new fire truck for the Eastford Independent Fire Company #1 for a total amount not to exceed \$500,000 in equipment and interest.

The bottom line of all these budget machinations is that the mill rate for the upcoming fiscal year increases to 26.11, up one mill from 25.11. The mill rate is determined by dividing the total of taxes to be raised [\$3,693,719] by the net grand list [\$141, 467,581]. In this context, one mill equals \$141,468. One mill produces one dollar for each \$1,000 of property assessment. For the Eastford taxpayer the one mill increase translates to a four percent tax increase.

Factoids: During the month of May, the Connecticut State Police [Troop D] issued nine traffic citations in Eastford and gave out six written warnings. There were a total of 47 calls for service in Town that month. In April, there were 32 traffic citations and 12 written warnings and a total of 72 calls for service.

The total value of construction for which building permits were issued in May in Eastford was \$212,601. Some 550

The Board of Selectmen, at its regular June meeting on June 7, set the mill rate for FY2017-2018 at 26.11, made its annual appointments to boards, committees and commissions; and awarded the contract for paving at the Transfer Station to P. Willis Construction, Inc. of Eastford. It also heard a report from the First Selectman on the Town Garage Energy Lighting Project which the Town has undertaken along with Eversource and Lantern Energy to retrofit lighting at the Town Garage, the garage exterior lighting, and lighting at the Salt Shed. Total annual estimated energy savings in dollars is \$1,232.68 and in kilowatt hours is 4,372 kWh per year.

The date and site of the July meeting of the Board of Selectmen have been changed, to Monday, July 17 at the Eastford Elementary School. The changes were made to accommodate a public hearing prior to the meeting on two ordinances which will be coming before the Board. These are an ordinance providing for the continuation of a joint park commission and an ordinance pertaining to the prohibition of fracking waste. The hearing begins at 7 p.m.

Sale of Transfer Station stickers for the 2017-2018 year will begin on Wednesday, July 5, 2017 and be conducted at the Transfer Station/Town Garage on those days and during those hours that the Transfer station is open during July. [Transfer Stations hours are Wednesdays from 1-3 p.m., and Saturdays and Sundays from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m.] Sales end on Sunday, July 30 and stickers must be on vehicles starting Wednesday, August 2. When purchasing a sticker, the cost of which will be \$50 this year, you must present the vehicle continued on next page



registration for the vehicle you will be using when utilizing the Transfer Station.

Wouldn't It Be Nice If:

• Folks realize that the Town, and therefore, you have expended some \$2 million in Federal, State, and Town funds to build a new bridge on Mill Bridge Road and to repave the road rather than to lay rubber with vehicles and ATVs on the new road and bridge surfaces and to damage nearby private property.

Folks realize that the Transfer Station is just that, a transfer station, and not a dump for all the excess items which cannot, or are not, sold at various tag sales. Following the recent Town-wide Tag Sale there was an inundation of left-over items, much of which were not placed in containers, buildings, or compactors. With rain following closely that Sunday, much of the items left outside became junk and created a major problem for Transfer Station and Public Works staff.

Verizon Wireless has submitted a proposal to the Connecticut Siting Council to construct a wireless telecommunications facility at 72 Ragged Hill Road in Pomfret Center, a site that is located within 2,500 feet of the Town of Eastford. The proposed Pomfret Center Facility would fill existing gaps in wireless service in the existing network in Pomfret, Eastford, and Woodstock and provide service along portions of Routes 198, 44, and 244 as well as local roads in the vicinity of the site. It will interact with existing cell sites in the area, including a major site on Pumpkin Hill in Ashford, overlooking Hall's Pond. The proposed Pomfret Center Facility will consist of a

150-foot monopole tower and related equipment located within a 50' by 50' fenced compound. There will be nine panel-type antennae at the top of the tower and equipment cabinets and a generator near the tower's base.

At our annual meeting on Tuesday, June 6th, the EIFC celebrated it 75th birthday of VOLUNTEER SERVICE to the Town of Eastford. And I quote:

"Following a regular town meeting on March 7, 1938, a special town meeting was held at which time First Selectman Mr. Lewin Newth spoke of a desire to provide adequate fire protection for the town. It was voted that the Chair appoint a committee to make an investigation and report its findings at the next regular meeting. The Committee consisting of Lewin Newth, Chairman, Alfred Warren and Harry Tatem were appointed."

The name of the fire department was established as the "Eastford Independent Fire Company #1"

At the May 5, 1942 meeting, 39 men were designated CHARTER MEMBERS.

FAST FORWARD to May 1, 1951 when the first formal meeting took place at the current site of the EIFC. FAST FORWARD to May 3, 1955 when the Ladies Auxil-

iary was formed. FAST FORWARD to 1965, when the Fire Police squad was created. FAST FORWARD to 1972 when 27 members received Red Cross Certification in Basic First Aid with 18 certified in Advanced First Aid. FAST FORWARD to 1982, when it was evident that medical emergencies were as important a response as was fire-fighting. The EIFC Rescue Squad was official.

FAST FORWARD to 2017, where the EIFC excels with programs on all levels. A good organization just doesn't happen. It takes time and commitment with most members spending 30 plus hrs. per month to keep us responding second to none. All members are competent in meeting the physical and mental demands of the job to keep Eastford safe. As we round out our 75th year of operation, we as

VOLUNTEERS are proud that we are an outstanding team of dedicated and well-trained firefighters and medical technicians that are ready and willing to respond without hesitation any time of the day or night, in good weather or bad, where and when we are needed.

General Lyon Cemetery Tour & Talk "The Incredible Story of Eastford's Famous General" By Ed Parry July 8, 2:30 pm

As part of Experience Eastford, Ed Parry will present a talk about General Nathaniel Lyon and the General Lyon Cemetery, 35 General Lyon Road, where the Civil War hero is buried. Eastford's most famous citizen, Nathaniel Lyon (July 14, 1818 - August 10, 1861), was the first Union general killed in the conflict during the Battle of Wilson's Creek in Missouri. Some 15,000 people attended his funeral in Eastford, including Congressmen. Ed Parry is a member of the Eastford Conservation and Historic Preservation Commission and is the curator of our cemeteries.

Did you know that when Beatrice Kennedy bought the Eastford House from Aaron Bowen on November 2, 1918, she was only 28 years old. On the suggestion of Judge J.M. Tatem, she changed its name to the General Lyon Inn in honor of Eastford resident and Civil War general, Nathaniel Lyon. She operated the Inn and served many delicious meals there for over 50 years. In 1947, a Sunday dinner of chicken or roast beef could be purchased for \$1.75!

OFFICE HOURS:



All Motor Vehicle taxes not paid by August 1, 2017 will be reported as delinquent to the Motor Vehicle Department and registrations will be denied.

If you receive a tax bill from a town you did not reside in on October 1, 2016, please contact the assessor. If you do not receive a tax bill for your real estate, motor vehicle or personal property please contact my office at (860) 974-1885 Ext. 6 for a duplicate bill. Per Connectictut General Statutes, failure to receive a bill does not relieve you of obligation to pay any tax or interest that is due.
