





- Maintain and provide access to public records as required by state law and regulations
- Provide certified copies of public records
- 3. Record, index, and preserve municipal land records, surveys, and maps
- Post meeting notices for local governmental bodies
- 5. Maintain official records of charters, ordinances, oaths, appointments, and petitions
- 6. Maintain public meeting minutes, agendas, and notices
- 7. Record trade names and military discharges
- 8. Issue certificates of authority to justices of the peace, notary publics, and Superior Court
- 9. Maintain official copies of town budgets, audits, and annual reports
- 10. Administer the oath of office to local elected and appointed officials





# **DID YOU KNOW? by Eastford Historical Society**

Did you know that the Charter Oak is one of the most important symbols in Connecticut history and that a descendant of the historic tree grows in Eastford?

Early lore claims that in the 1630's a delegation of Native Americans approached Samuel Wyllys, the settler who had cleared much of the land around the old oak tree in what is now Hartford, and encouraged him to preserve the tree. It had been planted ceremoniously for the sake of peace when the tribe first settled the area, and they believed it had guarded their ancestors for centuries. The tree had guided them for centuries as to when to plant their corn - when the leaves were the size of a mouse's ear, it was time to put the seed in the ground.

But Connecticut's colonial legend behind the historic white oak tree in Hartford really began 30 years later. In 1662, England's King Charles II granted the Connecticut Colony a Royal Charter guaranteeing the Colony the right to self-govern and the ability to elect its own officials without interference from the Crown. Charles' death in 1685 brought his brother, James II, to the throne. James disapproved of Royal Charters since they interfered with his plan to establish the Dominion of New England, which combined the New

England Colonies and the Colony of New York under the leadership of a Royal Governor. King James demanded the return of all Royal Charters and named Sir Edmond Andros the Dominion's Royal Governor. His first duty was to seize all Charters. In October 1867. Andros met with leaders of



the Connecticut Colony in a tavern in Hartford and demanded the return of the Connecticut Charter. The document was produced, and discussion ensued. The Connecticut Colony would not surrender the Charter. Suddenly the candle lights in the room went out. In the confusion the Charter was passed through a window to Captain Joseph Wadsworth. He hid it in the trunk of a large white oak on the Wyllys estate where it was protected from the King and Andros. Despite Connecticut's resistance, it became part of the Dominion for the next two years. In 1869 James II was overthrown, and Andros lost power in the colonies. The Charter emerged from hiding and was used to govern Connecticut until 1818.

On August 21, 1856, the Charter Oak, estimated at nearly 1,000 years old, fell during a torrential storm. The wood was used for many different projects. In 1986 the State offered sapling descendants of the Charter Oak to all 169 towns. The Town of Eastford accepted the sapling and, with the approval of Mark Sheldon, then president of the Union Society, planted it on the east lawn of the Union Society land on the corner of Routes 198 and 44 (land and building now owned by the Town of Eastford). On October 22, 2013, Edward A. Richardson of the CT Tree Project at Conn College inspected Eastford's tree and declared it a descendant of the original Charter Oak. He placed it on the Notable Tree Project listings as one of only 23 verified Charter Oak descendants in the state.

## 1) Absentee Voting:

New Laws passed last year expand opportunities that allow voters with temporary disabilities and chronic illnesses to automatically receive absentee ballots, allowing absentee voters with visual impairment to receive a ballot electronically,

### 2) a new law expands eligibility for absentee voting, mainly to commuters, caretakers and other voters worried about illness.

Previously, voters could only get an absentee ballot if they were working out of town during all polling hours on Election Day or if they personally had an illness or physical disability that made them unable to vote at their polling place during voting hours. Now, voters may qualify for an absentee ballot if they are traveling for only part of Election Day or if they are concerned about sickness, including COVID-19, for either themself or someone they are taking care of.
